

The Durrell Challenge 2020 FAQs

Is the only way to meet Henry Cavill through registering as a VIP and raising £1,200?

The Durrell Challenge is a fundraising event in aid of Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust, and Henry Cavill has once again kindly given up his time to support the event and its fundraising objectives. The VIP entry is supported by Henry, and where feasible he will meet with each person who has gone out of their way to take on a challenge, and raise significant funds for Durrell in doing so as a thank you. Outside of the VIP entry, there is no guarantee that fans will get to meet Henry Cavill.

If you register as VIP and raise over £1,200 for Durrell but decide not to run, are you still able to meet Henry Cavill?

If you are collecting sponsorship money from friends, family, and colleagues to take on the 13K race, (to stay within the spirit of fundraising guidelines) there is an obligation to take on the challenge. This is what people are sponsoring you for after all!

Supporters who are not participating in the challenge or raising funds, but instead wish to donate to Durrell, will not automatically qualify as a VIP as this is reserved for those that are taking on the 13K running challenge.

What happens if I cannot meet Henry Cavill?

Henry Cavill has once again kindly given up his time to support the Durrell Challenge and Durrell's fundraising objectives. He plans to have a presence on the day, however, in the unlikely event that he is unable to join us, for example due to late changes to his filming commitments or other unforeseen events, Durrell may at its discretion alter the terms of the VIP entry and/or prizes. Neither Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust nor Henry Cavill (or any of his agents, employees, or representatives) will have any liability whatsoever. We thank you for your understanding.

Can I walk or jog the race?

11:15 is the race cut-off time, giving you 2 hours and 15 minutes to complete the course. At this time the authorities will open the roads, honorary police and marshals will stand down, however all directional signage will remain in place. The finish line will remain open for longer should there still be runners on the course, but please note that any runners continuing to run after the cut-off time, will be doing so at their own risk and must follow the normal rules of running on a road.

Is there an age restriction for the 13K race?

Runners must be at least 16 years old on the day of the race (17 May 2020).

Does my 13K race ticket allow me entry to the Really Wild Day at Jersey Zoo?

Yes, the 13K race ticket does allow free entry into Jersey Zoo after the race to enjoy the Really Wild Day.

Do Really Wild Day tickets need to be booked in advance?

Really Wild Day tickets should be booked in advance to avoid disappointment on the day, however tickets will be available to purchase on the day, subject to availability.

Durrell members receive free entry to this event, but they are advised to book tickets online for free in order to reserve a place.

Where can I park?

Parking is available at Jersey Zoo however, parking is limited so we suggest people car-share if possible. Additional parking is available at the RJA & HS where we have a Park and Ride service that shall be in operation from 10:30–18:30 at a cost of £2/car.
